


How Member Agencies are Communicating with Travelers

Coalition members from 16 states discussed how they are providing safety and traveler information to their users. These methods include DMS, 511 websites and apps, social media, geofenced notifications, IVR, and much more. Many agencies are also investigating or piloting emerging technologies to enhance their program.

Agency members discussed the use of data in decision-making. For example, Maryland DOT is collaborating with UMD in analyzing their incident data to better determine the incident duration. By taking into account many factors, including incident type, number of vehicles, number of responders on the scene, and other factors, they are determining the "probable" duration for an incident.
