Notifications



"No Trucks in Left Lane"



Notifications strategically placed roughly every 15 miles in every 3+ lane sections of our roadways.



Roads receiving this notification:

I-80, I-195, I-280, I-287, I-295, I-676, NJ440, Turnpike, Parkway, and AC Expressway.



Purpose: Alleviate traffic congestion, increase the traffic flow rate, and increase safety.



QA/QC

- Your Name & Agency: NJDOT or SJTA (South Jersey Transportation Authority) or NJTA (NJ Turnpike Authority)
- Have you received Safety Alerts from Drivewyze app? (Yes/No)
- What kind of Alert Type did you experience: Sudden slowdown, Congestion ahead, Low bridge ahead,
 High rollover area, etc.
- Safety Alerts appeared for how long (5/10/15 seconds)?
- Route , Direction, MP when you received the Alert
- Date and Time of Alert
- Alert Method: Blinking of notification? Sound? Vibration?
- Can you correlate the Sudden Slowdown Alert/Congestion Ahead Alert to an Actual Incident or a slowdown?
- How many alerts did you receive for same incident?
- Accuracy: Early, On time, Late, No alert, Wrong alert, False alert, etc.
- Does the app drain too much battery?
- Any issues using the app?
- Other comments?

What is this grant all about?

- Get real time alerts of things that require ACTION on freeways
 - You must slow down traffic is moving slower ahead
 - You must change lanes there is an arrow board closing a lane
- Into people's EXISTING APPS (Waze, Google, Apple, Trucks, Cars...)
- Info is PUSHED
- Info is AUTOMATED
 - no human action needed
 - sensed, not entered
- Alerts are HANDS FREE and EYES FREE
- Builds on things we are already doing
- USDOT \$2 million SMART grant: Sept 2023 March 2025
- KPMG/ICF project management support







Effectiveness Measures

- We need to show who got alerts and what they did because of the alerts
- Like this from Drivewyze
- Approaches
 - AARA Contractor must provide an evaluation approach
 - "Internal"
 - NC State Students driving through areas and evaluating if alerts are showing on Apple, Google, and Waze
 - NCDOT SSP drivers reporting slow-down alerts – iPad and (hopefully) Siri




Evaluating Drivewyze using RITIS Congestion Scans






Mars Hill, ME

- In the path of totality:
 - KY, PA, NY, VT, NH, ME
- All states will have some level of visibility
 - New Hampshire 95%
 - Connecticut 90%+
 - Philly 88%

- Richmond - 83%

- Knoxville 90%
- Wilmington 70%
- Birmingham 86%
- Orlando 58%





2024 Eclipse (continued)

Traveler Info is front and center

- 4.5 min of totality, but approx. 3-hrs from start to finish
 - Our states...3.75-4 min
- Will cross mostly rural areas, but in close proximity to several urban hubs.
 - Expect motorists from the cities to travel outward to the rural viewing areas.



2017 Lessons Learned

 States not in the path will still likely be impacted – especially states bordering totality path

Monitor 2-lane roadways

 Like most planned events, inbound traffic may stagger but outbound is likely to be biggest impact



The Pathfinder

- A collaborative strategy for proactive transportation system management ahead of and during adverse weather events, which encourages State DOTs, NWS, and weather service contractors to share and translate weather forecasts and road conditions into consistent transportation impact messages for the public. (FHWA)
- FHWA encouraging this strategy for the eclipse



What does that mean?

- Become a primary source of information
 - Up-to-date and accurate traveler information
- Coordinate with NWS for weather conditions that could make viewing less optimal; communicate to the public
- Coordinate with local agencies and first responders
- Coordinate with construction/maintenance staff in areas of anticipated eclipse traffic
- Manage traveler expectations





LARGE-SCALE EVENT PREP

Effective and carefully planned traffic management strategies are crucial for a successful event, guaranteeing seamless vehicle flow, pedestrian safety, and minimal disturbances to neighboring communities.





PRE-EVENT COORDINATION

- Working with all involved agencies on the Unified Traffic Management Plan
- Collaborating with Local Authorities and Stakeholders
- Getting outside help (Waze community) involved sooner





EVENT TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN






FUNCTIONALITY AND ACCESSIBILITY REFRESHER

- The Navigation Hub is NOT designed to remove any of your current state's processes or to report daily or recurring incidents to navigation systems.
- The Navigation Hub is designed to help your state enhance its ability to work with navigation systems, as well as be a central location for members to request urgent assistance in escalating critical issues.
- The full re-release is scheduled for June! States will be provided training, and it will be up to the state to determine who they would like to share the Navigation Hub with.



TYPES OF INFORMATION ON THE UPDATED NAVIGATION HUB

- Expanding platforms to include Apple & TomTom
- Data formatting per navigation system
- General responses to the most common questions
- Waze community editor community state/regional leaders
- How-to documents (data/api/feeds)
- Major event/disaster information with navigation systems
