BILL GIOGIS

Owner, Mike's Wrecker Service

Bill is a second-generation owner of Mike's Wrecker Service in Saginaw, Michigan and is one of the towing and recovery industry's most vocal and well-spoken advocates. As former president of the Michigan Towing Association, he helped build strong ties in Lansing, appearing before legislators and negotiating with lobbyists on pertinent issues.

Bill also led the national charge as president of TRAA, gaining great credibility for TRAA within the DC community. Additionally, Giorgis conceptualized and worked to create the "Law Enforcement Vehicle Identification Guide" still in use today.

His commitment to improving safety within the industry has led to many speaking engagements within and outside of the industry. Bill is a certified rescue diver and assists local emergency agencies retrieve vehicles and bodies from the icy waterways around Saginaw. In addition, Bill devotes many hours to improving the Saginaw communities, earning recent recognition by the Saginaw County prosecutor's office for his assistance with crime victims. His accomplishments have made Bill the youngest member inducted into the International Towing and Recovery Hall of Fame, Class of 2002.



BILL WEBB

Executive Director,

Congressional Fire Services
Institute

Bill has served as Executive Director of the Congressional Fire Services Institute (CFSI) since 1995. As Executive Director, Bill works closely with members of Congress, federal agency officials and fire service leaders on developing federal legislation and enhancing federal programs designed to improve the readiness of our nation's fire and emergency services.

A writer and speaker, Bill has traveled throughout the country speaking at major conferences and trade shows. His written work has covered a broad range of first responder issues and has been featured in major fire service publications. In addition, he has served on several panels and testified before commissions, offering his insight on national fire service issues and programs.

Before joining CFSI, Bill worked for the Firefighter Combat Challenge as the project manager for the competition. A former member of the first Bush administration, he served as a special assistant to cabinet secretaries at the U.S. Departments of Education and Labor, preparing briefings and accompanying the secretaries as a personal travel aide. Bill is an honorary member of the Vienna, Virginia Volunteer Fire Department, the Delaware Volunteer Firemen's Association and the International Association of Fire Fighter' Local 36. He also serves on the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation Board of Directors.



BOB BEMIS
Director of Training, Wrap Reality

Sergeant (Ret.) Bob Bemis retired in 2017 as a Supervisor in the Operational Training Division at the Pennsylvania State Police Academy in Hershey. With over 30 years of law enforcement experience, he spent more than a decade as a trainer in many police disciplines, specializing in officer safety, self-defense and civil disorder tactics.

In March 2015, Sergeant Bemis was severely injured while assisting a disabled motorist along an interstate highway. Following months of hospitalization and rehabilitation, Bob returned to his duties at the Academy and continued teaching for more than a year before retirement. He shares the experience of his final 22 months in law enforcement as author of the book, "Forged in Scars & Stripes: A Trooper's Victory Over Critical Injury".

Following his retirement, Sergeant Bemis travels to raise awareness to the hazards present to emergency responders along our highways. He is the Director of Training for Wrap Reality, a virtual reality training solution for law enforcement and corrections. In his spare time, he volunteers with The Wounded Blue, the national support and assistance organization for injured & disabled officers.

He is a veteran of the United States
Marine Corps. As a Military Policeman,
he performed high-level security
assignments, first as a member of the
helicopter squadron responsible for
transporting the President, known as
"Marine One"; later, for the National
Military Command Center at the Pentagon.



BRAD HUGHESAdvocate, Traffic Safety

In March 2014, Brad stopped his patrol car to assist a local police officer with a 17-car crash. After parking his patrol vehicle on Midlothian Turnpike in Chesterfield County, VA, Brad turned on his emergency lights and walked around the SUV to get a reflective safety jacket. A pickup truck slammed into him and Brad was pinned between both vehicles, his legs were crushed.

Unfortunately, Brad lost both legs above the knee that night and now uses a wheelchair. He can only drive his vehicle if it is equipped with hand controls. The driver of the truck testified in court that he was twenty feet away before he saw Brad.

In the nine years since the crash, Brad has advocated for traffic safety, exploring the challenges and dangers of distracted driving by speaking to high schools, businesses, the military and both police and fire academies.



BRADY ROBINETTE

Lieutenant, Lubbock Fire Rescue

Brady started his career in the fire service as a volunteer with Wolfforth Fire & EMS 16 years ago. In 2011, he joined Lubbock Fire Rescue on a full-time basis and currently serves as a Lieutenant. Additionally, he serves on Lubbock Fire Rescue's Traffic Safety Committee.

In the wake of a struck-by-vehicle incident in Lubbock, TX, he authored an October 2020 Fire Engineering Magazine article titled "Roadway Incident Operations - What helmet is right for the job?". Brady serves on the ASTM E54 Protective Helmets Worn by Pedestrian Roadway Workers task group.



Program Manager,
National Policing Institute

Brett is a Program Manager at the National Policing Institute where he provides comprehensive project management for a portfolio of national training and technical assistance projects focused on improving officer safety. These projects include the Law Enforcement Officer (LEO) Near Miss reporting system, the only national, non-punitive near miss reporting system for the law enforcement profession, and the National Law Enforcement Roadway Safety Program (NLERSP), a BJA-funded program designed to reduce the number of officers injured and killed on the nation's roadways.

Brett's past work at the National Policing Institute includes research on officer safety training, police use of force, police foot patrol, public safety use of small, unmanned aircraft systems (sUAS), crime gun intelligence centers (CGICs) and law enforcement responses to critical incidents.

Brett earned a Master's Degree in Criminology, Law and Society from George Mason University and a Bachelor's Degree in Finance, with a minor in Leadership Studies, from Virginia Tech. In his spare time, Brett is a first responder with over nine years of experience at a volunteer fire and rescue department in Northern Virginia.

As someone that has been struck once and had two of his trucks struck while working roadside, Brian is acutely aware of the dangers of working roadside.

Dr. Candice McDonald has served her community for almost two decades as a firefighter, EMT, EMS chief and CE instructor and inspector. She is the president of the Cumberland Valley Volunteer Firemen's Association (CVVFA), past trustee with Women in Fire and past FDIC/Fire Engineering Advisory Board. She currently works for the National Volunteer Fire Council (NVFC) as the deputy CEO and is an adjunct professor for Eastern Gateway Community College.

Before joining the NVFC, she worked for NASA in the Office of Protective Services as a special agent, physical security specialist and contracting officer representative. Before working at NASA, she was the program coordinator for the Research Center for Educational Technology at Kent State University. Before joining the Kent State family, she spent six years working for the State of Ohio in marketing. Before that, she spent ten years working as a mental health case manager and drug and alcohol counselor.

CINDY IODICEFounder, CEO Flagman Inc

Cindy is rapidly emerging as a significant leader in transportation safety, passionately advocating for safety and the protection of first responders and highway workers.
Cindy's family has been deeply rooted in the towing industry for nearly 70 years, her father, Russ lodice, a celebrated figure, was inducted into the International Towing and Recovery Hall of Fame in 1995 for his exceptional contributions to Connecticut's towing community. Tragically, on April 22, 2020, Cindy's brother, Corey lodice, lost his life while assisting a stranded

Flagman promotes the importance of Slow Down Move Over laws and is becoming a formidable voice in advocating for traffic safety. Flagman's initiative educates drivers and future drivers about the importance of slowing down and moving over for first responders and highway safety workers. The organization teaches students about their responsibility when driving or riding in a motor vehicle and collaborates with policymakers to strengthen SDMO laws and establish a national Slow Down Move Over day.

Cindy received the 2020 Traffic Safety Leadership "HERO" Award from AAA Northeast in recognition of her unwavering dedication and tireless efforts to promote traffic safety.



COLONEL WOODROW W. JONES

Retired Lieutenant Colonel and Chief of the Field Operations Bureau, Maryland State Police

Colonel Woodrow W. Jones Ill's career with the Maryland State Police spanned 27 years and included various patrol, investigative, supervisory and command positions throughout the Department. He retired as a Lieutenant Colonel and Chief of the Field Operations Bureau, a key member of the command staff responsible for leading a patrol force of nearly 1,000 sworn and civilian personnel.

In November 2015, Governor Hogan appointed Colonel Jones to be Chief of the Maryland Transportation Authority Police. Colonel Jones led more than 600 sworn and civilian police professionals responsible for securing Maryland's critical infrastructure to include Maryland's toll roads, tunnels, bridges, BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport and the Port of Baltimore.

Colonel Jones was then appointed by Governor Larry Hogan to be the Secretary of the Maryland Department of State Police and 20th Superintendent of the Maryland State Police, on February 22, 2020. While serving as a cabinet member for Governor Hogan, Colonel Jones led the 2,400 sworn and civilian members of the Maryland Department of State Police until December 31, 2022.

Colonel Jones holds a Bachelor of Science degree and a Master of Science degree in Management from Johns Hopkins University and is a graduate of its Police Executive Leadership Program.



CRAIG R. SHUEY
Chief Operating Officer,
Pennsylvania Turnpike Division

Craig was appointed Chief Operating Officer of the Turnpike Commission in January 2011. In this role he is responsible for oversight, management and strategic planning for the day-to-day operation of the 565 miles of Turnpike and direct oversight of six departments, including Toll Collection Operations, Traffic Engineering and Operations, Maintenance and Human Resources. After working within patrol, Lieutenant Burckhardt became a member of the Collision Analysis and Reconstruction Specialist (C.A.R.S.) Unit for Troop K. As a member of the unit, he primarily investigated collisions with serious injuries and/or fatalities that resulted in prosecution.

He has been the lead investigator of several incidents resulting in serious injury and/or line of duty deaths of police officers, fire personnel and towing personnel. Lieutenant Burckhardt frequently testifies as an expert in the field of collision reconstruction and is accredited through the Accreditation Commission for Traffic Accident Reconstruction (A.C.T.A.R). He is currently assigned as the Station Commander of the Troop L, Reading Barracks.

Community Educator

Debra Laudenslager's son, Tyler, an employee of H&S Towing, Harrisburg, PA was killed July 21, 2020, by a distracted driver while providing roadside assistance to a disabled vehicle on I-78, in Berk's County, Pennsylvania.

Since Tyler's tragic death, Debra, along with Tyler's widow, Holly Laudenslager and Tyler's sister, Heather Laudenslager can often be found at various events in and around their local community educating the public about Distracted Driving and Pennsylvania's Move Over/Slow Down Law which Debra was instrumental in getting passed.

In 2022, the Tyler Laudenslager Memorial Fund non-profit was established to raise funds to assist families of tow operators and firefighters who have tragically perished in the Line of Duty.



DAVID DAGGET
